

1. Section Number & Heading
Enter the section number and heading exactly as it appears in the RFT. (e.g. "5.4 Service Hours of Operation").
2. RFT Section/Question Text Enter (copy and paste) the section/question text from the RFT.
3. Summary
Create a meaningful heading clearly signalling your purpose. Summarise the essence of your response in a sentence or two. Include key themes, messages and benefits. State
what you want the reader to do, know or feel.
4. Introduction
This should preview/road-map the main body text. Topics to be covered should be bulleted and appear in order of importance to the reader.





5. Body Text Body text should amplify the main points outlined in the Introduction. details. Headings should exactly reflect the bullets in the introduction. "our/we" etc. Use bullet lists where possible.	Provide Refrain	convincing from using
